Course Overview:

What do great writers do? This will be the guiding question of our work in 5th grade writing this year. In this course, students will discover that great writers...

- know and use all eight major parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, conjunctions, prepositions, and interjections)
- write complete, grammatically correct, and detailed sentences of various types
- write well-organized paragraphs full of appropriate, relevant, and specific details
- use the steps of the writing process to plan, draft, revise, edit, and publish pieces of writing
- respond in writing to what they read
- write using a variety of genres (narrative, informational, response to literature, open response, persuasive, poetry, drama, friendly letter, etc.)
- use the six traits of writing to improve the ideas, sentence fluency, organization, word choice, voice, and conventions in pieces of writing
- know that writing is never finished, it is only done for now

The goal of the fifth grade writing curriculum is for students to master the structural building blocks of sentences and paragraphs and to begin to develop their own authorial voices in various forms of writing.

Additional expectations:

Students will use a Writer's Notebook to practice and develop their ideas as writers. They will collect and organize their work in Writing Portfolios which will be used throughout the year to reflect on individual skills, challenges, and progress. Students will also learn and practice vocabulary and spelling words through a phonics-based spelling program.

Spelling and vocabulary will be taught on an ongoing basis throughout the year.
